Call Process Update

Blessings to you in this Easter season as God continues to show us signs of new life. One place that new life is happening is that we are re-engaging in the call process to call an associate pastor.

This process began when Pastor Rusty Brace accepted a call to Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Oakdale Minnesota. This process paused in December 2019 with the reality that our financial status at the time did not have the ability to fund a second full-time pastor.

A lot has happened since that time. We have been through 13+ months of a global pandemic where ministry was creatively adapted and new ways of doing ministry were born.

We also experience a very positive stewardship response this fall. Your generous giving and increased giving provide the financial means where we can strengthen our ministry with the calling of a second fulltime pastor.

Here is a review of the Call Process steps that began back in 2019, and after having paused have now started up again.

STEP ONE: Celebrating the ministry that we shared with Pastor Rusty Brace.

STEP TWO: We sought an interim pastor to help with carrying out our ministry. Pastor Chris Becker was hired to service for 10 to 15 hours per week, and he did that wonderfully.

STEP THREE: A Mission Exploratory Team. This team reached out to the congregation through surveys and explored and documented our congregation's vision, ministry needs, and the gifts and skills needed in a future pastor.

This information was put into something called a Ministry Site Profile (MSP) that our synod office will share with potential pastoral candidates. At this time we are revising the ministry site profile to update it with the changes and learnings that we've experienced over the past year.

The assembling of a Call Committee began in 2019 and is now being finalized. Our desire is to have a cross-section of members who represent our congregation and who put the needs of the whole congregation above their own personal thoughts or groups they are most closely connected to.

You can anticipate in the coming weeks that we will host a "Town Hall" Meeting where the congregation will be introduced to the members of the Call Committee and have a chance to review and comment on the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). STEP FOUR: The call Committee will do an orientation with Assistant to the Bishop, Reverend Justin Grimm.

The Call Committee will be preparing candidate packets and interview questions, and will receive then a list of candidates names and begin interviewing pastoral candidates.

That process of when interviews begin to how long it takes to discern a final candidate can vary greatly.

STEP FIVE: EXTENDING A CALL -When the Call Committee does discern a final candidate they will present the recommendation to the Church Council. Background checks will be performed and a date will be set for a congregational meeting.

Some type of "meet and greet" will be held for the candidate and congregation in advance of the congregational vote. The candidate will also meet with Church Staff and the Church Council prior to the congregational vote.

If there is an affirming "yes" vote a Letter of Call with the terms of compensation and pastoral responsibilities will be sent to the pastoral candidate.

If the pastoral candidate accepts within 30 days, arrangements will be made for a start

date, installation, and other plans to get ministry off to a good start.

We are on track to have a new Associate Pastor begin as early as September. That is when our budget for a new pastor begins.

COMMUNICATION: During this process the Call Committee will do their best to provide regular, ongoing updates. Please note there will be times that this process will feel really slow. The call committee cannot share confidential information about who they are interviewing, but the updates will try to tell you where we are at in the process.

WHAT CAN I DO? -The Call process there's one that alongside all the paperwork and planning most importantly is one that relies on the work of the Holy Spirit in prayer. I ask you to be in regular prayer for the Holy Spirit to prevail that the right fit is made between this congregation and the pastor so that God's mission, ministry and Kingdom will be furthered.

Saturday, May 15: 3:00 & 5:00 Sunday, May 16, 10:30 a.m. & 1:00 p.m.


