9th grade Confirmation students will affirm their baptism on this very special day. Confirmands should arrive 20 minutes prior to the service that they will be confirmed at. Youth should dress nicely (same as rehearsal), put on their robe and stole and meet in the Gathering Area. This service is a very special service and pivotal point in your faith life. There will be a time during the confirmation service for each youth to come forward for a "laying on of hands". Youth are encouraged to invite family, friends and other mentors in their faith life to be a part of this special moment. All services will be live-streamed.

BE THE LIGHT

As I sit contemplating the arrival of autumn, the fall equinox, I am reminded that on this day for a moment there are equal hours of daylight and darkness. Then the swift spiral to long, longer, longest days of darkness begins... until the Winter Solstice...the longest night....and then we climb back out of the darkness into the light.

The Winter Solstice is the festival that's mentioned the most times in the Bible! It is when Jewish people remember that they depended on God for all they had after they had escaped from Egypt and spent 40 years in the desert. It also celebrates the end of the harvest.

In the Bible, light has always been a symbol of holiness, goodness, knowledge, wisdom, grace, hope, and God's revelation. By contrast, darkness has been associated with evil, sin, and despair.



How can we live in the light of Jesus? Light gives us life. Christ's light is like that. Christ teaches us in scripture that faith keeps the darkness at bay. ... The good news is that Christ's light gives us life, and in turn we can share Christ's light with others when their light grows dim, or darkness overwhelms someone close to us. Share the goodness, grace, and mercy of our Lord and Savior. Be the light in someone's life...let it shine!
