Interns often bring new ideas and new energy into a congregation. We are excited about this possibility. It will allow us to continue moving ahead with our ministry goals, but still be good stewards of our financial resources.

It will be April before we know if we will be assigned an intern, but our chances of getting one are good. The intern would be with us for one year. Pastor Chris Becker will remain with us during this time. And we can begin the call process for an associate pastor whenever our finances allow.

Farmington Lutheran would be an excellent teaching congregation for a potential intern. And we look forward to the new gifts an intern would bring!
