

February is here already! The month of continued cold and snow warmed by the declarations of love in the Hallmark holiday...

Valentine's Day. If you strip away the commercialism of the day, do you think it speaks to what love really is? How God loves us and how he wants us to love others?

When it comes to God's loving us, He does not dole it out in some miserly way so that we get just enough to survive on. He pours it out lavishly, but we so often fail to grasp it and so our lives are not rooted in love but in fear, guilt, shame, or insecurity. Our lives are to be lived out of a deep awareness of how much we are loved. He wants us to experience incredible, life-changing love, mercy, and compassion not only from him, but from those around us. And he wants us to show that love to others.

The call to love is often difficult, but it is also a reminder of how God loves us: relentlessly, completely, and without expectation of return We may think we are not worthy of that love. In which case we need to realize that the love of God is not a payback for our good behavior, it is a free gift offered to all, worthy or not. We may wonder how anybody could love us because we have had so little experience being loved by other humans. We need to realize that God is not like those other human beings whose love for us is ego driven, fickle, or sometimes disastrously misguided.

The bottom line of our lives of faith is that God loves us, and that Jesus is evidence of this. Everything else stems from this. Being loved is the rich soil from which everything good grows.
