
Gardens at FLC

Just A Minute (for spiritual growth)

BE A LEADER LIKE JESUS. Written by Linda Morris

John 13:13–17 "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them."

Matthew 20:26 It will not be so among you; but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant.

Be a leader like Jesus. To be a great leader it takes courage, discipline, and determination. A great leader can bring great success, but it comes at the cost of being judged and overwhelmed. So many wonderful leaders God blessed for their leadership work. God spoke to encourage men and women who choose to step up and lead. We need more of those people, especially in our world today.
