ADVENT IN A BOX

In this year of trying new things, Advent is no different!

Introducing Advent in a Box. This is a multi-generational program so that FLC folks can recognize and celebrate the season of Advent together while staying safely apart. There are two parts to this program: a box of materials that should be picked up at church and weekly videos throughout Advent. Ideally, folks will participate with both the box and the videos but you can do just one or the other.

Boxes: Boxes will contain an Advent calendar with a verse and activity or reflection/ discussion question and a prayer for each day. There will be activities that are appropriate for families with young children as well as ones for older families and adults. They can be used by families, couples or individuals of all ages. Boxes will also contain materials for crafts that can be done throughout the season. Boxes will be sent home with

children who are in Sunday School or Wednesday School. Other families should sign up online or notify the church office if you would like a box. They will be available to pick up beginning on Sunday November 15th.

Videos will be posted online each of the four Sundays of Advent. The 10-15 minute videos will include lighting of the advent candle, a short reading and reflection, music and prayers. They are designed to played while you are at home so that we can be lighting our candles, singing the same songs and praying the same prayers as a community while we await the fulfillment of God's glorious promise – the birth of Jesus.

We are called to live for the sake of our neighbors. In connecting our faith to our actions we have responded to local and regional needs for food, PPE, and blood donations. We accompany those who are hurting with pastoral and congregational care. We developed phone call ministries to stay in touch and pray together. A time such as this has it's challenges, but in partnership together we experience the reality that 'Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus!" We want to address the needs and challenges in people's lives, and overcome those barriers so people know the transforming love of Jesus. Farmington Lutheran Church is trying to further God's mission by:

Overcoming hopelessness by worshiping a Lord who loves, forgives, and sends us outward to live for the sake of the other,

Overcoming isolation with new ways of connecting,

Overcoming racism with a desire to better understand and seek justice,

Overcoming mental health challenges by training, support, and breaking stigmas,

Overcoming limitations of restricted gatherings and busy schedules with tools for the home, online resources, creative and safe gathering opportunities, and other ways to nurture faith each day.

With an additional \$75,000 in giving in 2021, Farmington Lutheran Church will impact the congregation and community in powerful ways.

CONNECTING IN FAITH

Farmington Lutheran Church will invest in building connections and deepening faith through:

- Expanding available Bible Studies and other Spiritual Growth offerings, both online and in person.
- Strengthening and further the reach of pastoral care, congregational care team, and telephone ministry efforts.
- Strengthening our Outreach and Service ministries to better respond to local needs.
- Offering mid-week intergenerational worship both in-person and online as a core part of Children's, Youth & Family Ministries.
- Growing in understanding and actions needed to support racial justice. This includes engagement in book studies, convening conversations, and utilizing guest speakers and further training. These first steps will guide the congregation into the future. The church can't be silent!

Calling a second full time pastor by fall of 2021 to oversee Spiritual Growth, Pastoral and Congregational Care, and Outreach will bring the capacity to reach these goals.





CONNECTING THROUGH TECHNOLOGY

Strengthening digital ministries will connect people in faith each day. The addition of a second camera for worship as well as new editing and recording software will enhance not only online worship and music experiences, but online devotions, Bible stories, and other offerings as well. Offering Bible classes and other opportunities in a hybrid style will connect both with those who can meet in person and those who need to connect virtually.


STRENGTHEN MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS AND SUPPORT

Death by suicide has impacted loved ones in the Farmington community, with the pandemic adding to the mental health challenges. Building on existing community partnerships and efforts through the Farmington Mental Health Alliance will provide people the support they need and break negative stigmas.
